The degradation of the ecosystem and the destruction of the environment are part of war and the preparation of war.

Nato adopted a Climate Change and Security Action Plan as well as an action plan to protect the environment in conjunction with its activities.

We demand you to take this seriously, by not supporting the use of Depleted Uranium or any other toxic and radioactive substance and by helping the civilian population that suffers from the impact of these weapons. Part of this help is the environmental remediation of affected areas.

In the context of NATO's DU war actions in Serbia in 1999 this would mean not to reject the talks on the claims raised by our cooperation partner Dr. Sdran Aleksic in the legal proceedings that he strated at the Belgrade Court . NATO unjustly pretends immunity in this case

In the name of ICBUW I remind NATO of its own promises as well as of existing international legal obligations of the organisation such as the precautionary principle. Is NATO going to keep these promises and legal obligations?
